I am writing to you in regard to our recent transition to clustered parishes here in Adrian. My intent and purpose is to make this transition go as smoothly as possible. With that said, it is inevitable that there will be issues of contention that arise as we go through this process. I am confident that if we work on them together, we can resolve them in the most equitable manner. Everyone is not going to be satisfied with every decision or change, but decisions must be made and change inevitably needs to occur for this to work.

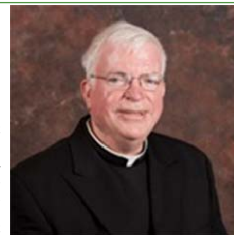
First I would like to thank you for your support during this time. Transitions, such as this, are not easy and I am still working on developing a schedule so I can spend time profitably at both parishes. Be patient with me as I work on the impact this transition has on me. I am very grateful for the

encouragement and welcome many have given to me at St Joseph's.

I would like to address a few concerns that have been voiced to me. As Sister Rita stated in our open meeting, both churches retain their individual names. It is true that when the merger comes St. Joseph's will be designated as a chapel. I think that is an unfortunate term to be used because it denotes an inferior status in the minds of some people and there is no intent to designate one church as superior to the other. When we become one parish there can be only one church and all others become chapels. I believe that both worship sites will remain open as long as it is financially feasible. So in reality, your continued support of the parishes will determine the direction things go in the future – long after I and some of you are gone.

I would ask that you help me in this transition by sharing your thoughts, fears and concerns. During the Q and

A time I allotted during my second weekend at St. Joseph's only one person came with a question and yet I am fully aware there is much discussion going on in various circles within the parishes. I cannot give answers to questions that are not posed to me. Disruptive behavior, has no place in a Christian community. Either come on board or discover where you can have your spiritual needs best satisfied, but don't create disharmony because of your dissatisfaction.



I am very attuned to the concerns this clustering creates, especially among some of the parishioners of St Joseph's, but let us continue to walk this journey side by side rather than on opposite sides of the street.

aliento y la bienvenida que muchos de San José me han dado.

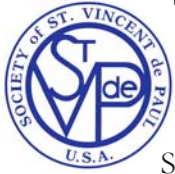
Me gustaría mencionarles sobre algunas inquietudes que me han expresado. Cuando vino la Hermana Rita a la junta abierta, nos dijo que ambas iglesias mantendrán sus nombres individuales. Es cierto que cuando la fusión ocurra, San José será designada como capilla. Creo que es un término desafortunado para ser utilizado porque denota un estatus inferior en la mente de algunas personas y no hay ninguna intención de designar una iglesia como superior a la otra. Cuando nos convertimos en una parroquia puede haber solamente una iglesia y todas las demás se convierten en capillas. Creo que ambos sitios de adoración permanecerán abiertos siempre y cuando económicamente sea posible. Así que, en realidad, su continuo apoyo a las parroquias determinará el rumbo en que las cosas tomen en un futuro, mucho después de que yo y algunos de ustedes nos hayamos ido.

Les pido que me ayuden en este cambio compartiendo sus pensamientos, temores y preocupaciones. Durante el tiempo de Preguntas y Respuestas en el segundo fin de semana de Julio sólo una persona de San José vino con una pregunta y sin embargo, estoy consciente, de que hay mucha discusión en los diversos círculos de las dos parroquias. No puedo dar respuestas a las preguntas si no me las hacen a mí. El comportamiento disruptivo, no tiene lugar en una comunidad cristiana. Así es de que acompañemos en nuestro caminar o descubra donde puede satisfacer su necesidad espiritual, pero no esté creando discordia debido a su propia insatisfacción.

Estoy muy sensible a las preocupaciones que esta agrupación crea, especialmente entre los feligreses de San José, pero continuemos caminando este camino uno al lado del otro en lugar de en los lados opuestos de la calle.

TEMPORARY MASS TIMES

Effective August 5/6, 2017

Saturdays: 4:00 p.m. at St. Mary and 5:30 p.m. at St. Joseph

Sundays: 7:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. (Bilingual) at St. Mary and 9:00 a.m. at St. Joseph

Next week our temporary Mass schedule goes into effect. I emphasize temporary because it has to be temporary until we get a better grasp on things and attendance at particular Masses and the capacities for each church.

To begin with our daily Mass schedule will be 8:15 Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at St Mary's and 8:15 on Thursday and Friday at St Joseph's. St Joseph's will continue the 5:15 evening Mass on Tuesday

Father Rayapa leaves us on August 28 so starting that week our schedule will be 8:15 Mass on Monday and Wednesday at St Mary's and Tuesday and Friday at St Joseph's. These will be the only daily Masses offered because I intend to keep Thursdays as my day off and the Motherhouse offers Mass at 10:30 AM every day. Holiday Masses starting with Labor Day will be at 9AM and alternate between the two churches; Labor Day Mass will be at St Joseph's.

In regard to the weekend schedule; starting next week we will follow the schedule as stipulated above. The schedule to begin in November will be an 8, 10 and Noon Mass and that will be the only Masses offered; The noon Mass will be at St Mary's and will continue to be bi-lingual. The 8 and the 10 will be determined by what we see after the summer vacations have ended. One English Mass on Sundays in each church.

This is probably where the first hurt of this clustering will be felt because it will involve the giving up of precedence in regard to worship habits. Obviously people are going to have to give up their preferences and come to realize we are one community of faith despite the differences that historically have existed between the two churches.

It is time to move on and the schedule is doable as long as I have Fr Mike living here but his work demands that he be absent from Adrian on occasion and the schedule has to be one I can do alone. The pace of my life has already increased and I have a good sense about what I can do and this is the only option for me if I am to serve you with my limited abilities.

La próxima semana nuestro horario de misas temporal entrará en vigencia. Digo temporalmente porque tiene que ser temporal hasta que tengamos una mejor idea de las cosas y la asistencia a las misas y en particular en la capacidad de cada iglesia.

Para empezar nuestras misas de entre semana serán 8:15 a.m. los lunes, martes y miércoles en Sta. María y 8:15 a.m. el jueves y viernes en San José. San José continuará con la misa de la tarde a las 5:15p.m. los martes.

El Padre Rayapa nos deja en el día 28 de Agosto, así que a partir de esa semana nuestro horario será: la misa de 8:15 a.m. los lunes y miércoles en Sta. María y los martes y viernes en San José. Estas serán las únicas misas diarias (de entre semana) ofrecidas porque tengo la intención de mantener los jueves como mi día libre y la Casa Madre ofrece misa a las 10:30 a.m. todos los días. Las misas de los días festivos comenzando con el Día del Trabajo serán a las 9 a.m. y serán alternadas entre las dos iglesias; La misa del Día del Trabajo será en San José.

Respecto al horario del fin de semana; A partir de la próxima semana tendremos las siguientes misas en San José: sábado a las 5:30 p.m. y domingo a las 9 a.m. Sta. María: sábado a las 4p.m. y domingos a las 7:30 a.m., 10:30 a.m. y 12:30 p.m., (la última misa será bilingüe) El horario para noviembre será una misa de 8 a.m., 10 a.m. y 12:00 p.m. y serán las únicas misas ofrecidas; la misa del mediodía será en Sta. María y continuará siendo bilingüe. La misa de 8 y 10 estarán determinados de acuerdo a lo que veamos después de que terminen las vacaciones de verano. Una misa en inglés los domingos en cada iglesia.

Esta es probablemente la primera dificultad de la unión de las dos iglesias porque implicará la renuncia a la precedencia con respecto a los hábitos donde adoramos. Obviamente, la gente va a tener que renunciar a sus preferencias y llegar a darse cuenta de que somos una comunidad de fe a pesar de las diferencias que históricamente han existido entre las dos iglesias.

Es hora de seguir adelante y el horario que estamos poniendo es realista siempre y cuando tengamos al Padre Mike viviendo aquí, pero su trabajo exige que él se ausente de Adrian de vez en cuando y el horario tiene que ser algo que yo pueda hacer solo. El ritmo de mi vida ya ha aumentado y tengo un buen sentido de lo que puedo hacer y esta es la única opción para mí si quiero servirles con mis habilidades limitadas.

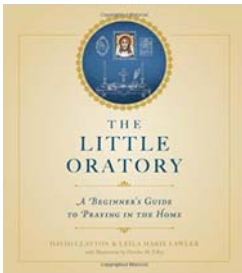

"Be Bold, Be Catholic"

(Prayer, Study, Generosity & Evangelization)

Change:

As a faith community we are experiencing some exciting times with the recent clustering of St Mary and St Joseph. But, for many change can be a very troubling and stressful time due to the unknown as we ask ourselves: what is going to happen, why are we making these changes and what does all of this mean to me personally resulting in turmoil and uncertainty in our lives. However, change is not always a bad thing and one example that comes to mind illustrating the positive aspect of change is the Exodus.

When Moses led the Hebrew people out of Egypt God was going to lead them to the Promised Land, but because of their lack of trust and faith in God they wandered through the desert for forty years. During this journey they were forced to endure hardships such as hunger & thirst. Many even desired to return to a life of slavery, a life they knew and understood rather than live through the changing and turbulent world they were living in. They were afraid of the change, the unknown in their lives even though God had already saved them from slavery & destruction at the hands of the Pharaoh; they were unable to fully trust in the Lord allowing the Spirit to guide them. In the end God delivered His promise and the people were allowed to enter the Promised Land.

We need to learn from this story, you see we are a pilgrim people on a journey home to God, to the eternal Promised Land and we need to trust in God allowing the Spirit to guide not only us but also His Church including the leadership in our local Diocese and Parishes. Trusting that decisions are truly being guided by the Holy Spirit and that at the end of our journey God will lead us HOME.

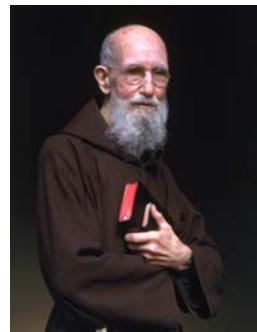
VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL
